A break from your caring role

If your health is affected by caring for someone who would be unable to manage without your help you may be eligible to apply for a carers grant





About us

Carers in Bedfordshire is a not-for-profit registered charity and a member of The Princess Royal Trust for Carers.

We exist to provide unpaid carers and former carers throughout Bedfordshire with help, support, advocacy and training according to their wishes and to involve them in the planning of future services.

What is a Carers Grant?

Carers in Bedfordshire has been given funding by NHS Bedfordshire to support informal unpaid carers of any age who have a long term health condition, or whose health is affected by their caring situation (for example, back injury, stress related illness, psychological ill health) to take a break.

The grant is towards paying for a service or break to support you as a carer to look after your health or well-being.





The Carers Grant cannot be used for something that could be funded by health or social services.

Who can apply for funding?

Carers who without payment (excluding benefits) provide substantial care or support to a child, relative, friend or family member who could not manage without their help, due to frailty or age, mental or physical health problems, disability or addiction.

This grant is not means tested and will not affect your benefits.

How much can I apply for?

- Carers as individuals can apply for up to £200.
- Additional funds may be available in certain circumstances
- Young carers under the age of 18 may apply for a grant via the young carers grant. Please contact Janice Shankland on 0300 111 1919.

How will the grant be paid?

Carers who are awarded the grant will be reimbursed upon a valid receipt of the agreed service.

Carers in Bedfordshire will issue a cheque payable to the travel company, college course, transport company, professional respite carer or the service you have chosen.
